

## War in Heaven

- In the pre-mortal existence, two plans were promoted
- Father's plan: agencySatan's plan: force
- 2/3 chose the risky path of freedom
- \* Today we face the same choices: liberty (agency) or slavery (force)
- War in Heaven was a political war (words, laws)




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### War in Heaven

- Same war continues today
- That war, so bitter, so intense, has never ceased. It is the war between truth and error, between agency and compulsion, between the followers of Christ and those who have denied Him."

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## Politics and Religion

- War in Heaven spills over into political realm
- \* Are men to be given agency, or dealt with by force?
- True religion (eternal principles)
   apply to political sphere
- Cannot separate the two unless government is secular and atheistic (unwilling to accept "selfevident truths")
- If not based on truths, government is based on lies
- \* Absolute truth exists relativism (i.e. "there is no right or wrong") is Satan's idea



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## Politics and Religion

- Absolute truth covers all realms of society (politics, religion, economics, etc.)
- "Right is still right. Wrong is still wrong, no matter how cleverly cloaked in respectability or political correctness."

- \* Freedom is based on truth, and no man is completely free as long as any part of his belief is based on error.

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## Truth vs. Error

- ❖ God is the author of all truth (Ether
  4:12) and cannot lie (Ether 3:12)
- If government is based on truth (eternal principles), it is built upon the rock (3 Ne. 18:12-13)
- If based on anything else (lies, theories, half-truths, etc.) it is built upon sand.
- Truth found in *true* religion will be found in the sphere of politics (proper government)

## Religious Influence in Politics

## Religious Influence in Politics

- The great vital and conservative element in our system is the belief of our people in the pure doctrines and divine truths of the gospel of Jesus Christ."

### Church and State

- Many argue for separation of church and state
- Source of idea is a quote from Thomas Jefferson to the Danbury Baptists - not anywhere found in founding documents
- \* "Earlier Courts had always viewed Jefferson's Danbury letter for what it was: a personal, private letter to a specific group. There is probably no other instance in America's history where words spoken by a single individual in a private letter words clearly divorced from their context have become the sole authorization for a national judicial policy."
  - David Barton, Original Intent, p. 48




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### Church and State

- \* First amendment guarantees freedom of religion, not freedom from religion
- \* Religious men (or as D&C 98:10 says, "honest men and wise men") should be sought after for govt. positions
- \* Church and state (or, religion and politics) should not and cannot be separated in a free republic.
- \* "And can the liberties of a nation be thought secure if we have lost the only firm basis, a conviction in the minds of the people that these liberties are the gift of God? That they are not to be violated but with His wrath?"

### Freedom

- With freedom comes personal responsibility; the two cannot be separated
- \* "Basic to an understanding of a right is the realization that it cannot exist without a matching duty; for what can a right consist of other than the enforcement of a duty concerning it?"
  - H. Verlan Andersen, *Moral Basis of a Free Society*, p. 21
- Freedom necessarily includes freedom to fail (law of the harvest)
- If you remove freedom to fail, there is no freedom
- \* What is more important: never failing or being free? This was the crucial choice in the War in Heaven




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## Law of the Harvest

- Agency consists of two basic options:
  - \* Action: you can choose what course of action you will take; outcome will be dictated by law
  - Outcome: you can choose what outcome you desire; course of action is dictated by law
- \* You reap what you sow
- "...what is the real cause of [breaking the law of the harvest]? In the last analysis, in my judgment, it is personal unrighteousness. When people do not use their freedoms responsibly and righteously, they will gradually lose these freedoms.

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## Agency

- Choosing Father's plan of agency necessitated the atonement
- \* Atonement was the *action* required by the *desired outcome* of agency and eternal life
- \* Agency is an eternal principle
- "...free to choose liberty and eternal life, through the great Mediator of all men, or to choose captivity and death, according to the captivity and power of the devil" (2 Nephi 2:27)



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## Freedom's Importance

\* 'As important as are all other principles of the gospel, it was the freedom issue which determined whether you received a body. To have been on the wrong side of the freedom issue during the War in Heaven meant eternal damnation. How then can Latter-day Saints expect to be on the wrong side in this life and escape the eternal consequences?" — Ezra Taft Benson, April 1965, General



## America's Promise

- \* "For behold, this is a land which is **choice above all other** lands; wherefore he that doth possess it **shall serve God or shall be swept off**; for it is the everlasting decree of God. And it is not until the fulness of iniquity among the children of the land, that they are swept off." (Ether 2:10)
